

# **Title of Design Lab:**

## **Community Health Databases**

## **Topic Champion:**

### **Summary of session**

In 2013, the Louisiana Public Health Institute (LPHI) created a community health database that compiled data from a variety of academic, government and public health sources. Partners will be able to layer their own data with other sources in a centralized location creating a unique opportunity for collaboration, including leveraging resources for future data collection needs and new business opportunities for robust data sharing. Design lab participants learned about LPHI's role as a 'neutral data convener', their partnership model for creating the community health database, and lessons learned.

#### **Key Takeaway points:**

- 1. Participants learned about LPHI's approach for identifying partners and process for compiling data into community database
- 2. Participants learned about LPHI's role as a 'neutral data convener' and crowdsourcing data for potential business opportunities (i.e. NOLA healthy website, technical assistance on data utilization, etc.)
- 3. Identified community health indicators, potential partners and next steps
- 4. Discussed plans for sustainability and maintenance of the community health database

- Topic Champion will follow-up with participants about other approaches to continue interorganizational learning on this topic.
