Why PCORI?

- Research has not answered many questions patients face.
- People want to know which treatment is right for them.
- Patients need information they can understand and use.





PCORI Has a Broad and Complex Mandate

"The purpose of the Institute is to assist patients, clinicians, purchasers, and policymakers in making informed health decisions by advancing the quality and relevance of evidence concerning the manner in which diseases, disorders, and other health conditions can effectively and appropriately be prevented, diagnosed, treated, monitored, and managed through research and evidence synthesis...and the dissemination of research findings with respect to the relative health outcomes, clinical effectiveness, and appropriateness of the medical treatments, services..."

PCORI Is Accountable for Changing Practice

"(g) FINANCIAL AND GOVERNMENTAL OVERSIGHT. ...

(2) REVIEW AND ANNUAL REPORTS.

(iv) Not less frequently than every 5 years ... the overall effectiveness of activities conducted under this section ... such review shall include an analysis of the **extent to which research findings are used by health care decision-makers**, the effect of the dissemination of such findings on **reducing practice variation and disparities** in health care..."

PCORI helps people make informed health care decisions, and improves health care delivery and outcomes, by producing and promoting high integrity, evidence-based information that comes from **research guided by patients, caregivers and the broader health care community.**







Comparative Clinical Effectiveness Research

- Patient-centered
- Answering questions that matter to patients and other clinical decision makers
- Comparisons of outcomes that matter to patients

PCORI Emphasizes *Engagement* **for Getting to Practical**, Useful Research



History of the Pipeline to Proposal Initiative

- Idea came from patients and stakeholders at Engagement Workshop
- Purpose is to build a community of patients and stakeholders who have the expertise and passion to participate in PCOR, and create partnerships within communities that lead to high-quality research proposals.
- Awards available to individuals or groups of patients, other stakeholders, or researchers.

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Pipeline to Proposal Awards



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Or submissions to other PCOR/CER Funders



Tier I Pipeline Awards (Up to \$15,000 for up to 9 months)

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Available to individuals, consumer/patient organizations, clinician(s), researcher(s) or a combination of the above to support:

- Community building around an area of research interest to improve outcomes for patients
- Creation of structure and communication strategies
- Develop an understanding of PCORI, and "research done differently"





Tier II Pipeline Awards (Up to \$25,000 for up to one year)

Available to emerging research/nonresearch partnerships to support:

- Data network and registry development
- Development of infrastructure
- Generation and refinement of research question through community events, town hall meetings, etc.





Tier III Pipeline Awards (Up to \$50,000 for up to one year)

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Available to advanced research/non-research partnerships, including those who submitted PCORI proposals and were not funded, to support:

- PCORI research proposal (re)submission focusing on development of engagement plan
- Research partnership skill development

The National Patient-Centered Clinical Research Network (PCORnet)

Clinical Data Research Networks

System-based networks, such as hospital systems

Patient-Powered Research Networks

Patients with a single condition form a research network

Coordinating Center

Provides technical and logistical assistance under the direction of the Steering Committee and PCORI staff

- 11 Networks
- \$76.8 Million Awarded

- 18 Networks
- \$16.8 Million Awarded



Pragmatic Clinical Studies and Large Simple Trials

Seeks to fund investigator-initiated research that compares two or more alternatives for:

- Addressing prevention, diagnosis, treatment, or management of a disease or symptom
- Improving health care system—level approaches to managing care; or
- Eliminating health or healthcare disparities.
- Research topics of particular interest identified by stakeholders or questions included in IOM's Top 100 Topics for CER or AHRQ's Future Research Needs.

Eugene Washington PCORI Engagement Awards

Awards of up to \$250,000 to provide "wrap-around" support and enhance impact of PCORI's research initiatives.

Objectives

- Engage new groups who have not previously been involved with PCORI
- Develop new mechanisms for disseminating research findings
- Promote research done differently by supporting engagement and partnering in the conduct and usage of comparative effectiveness research

- Knowledge
- Training and Development
- Dissemination and Implementation
