We were excited to debut the Collaborative Practice Design Labs this year. These sessions were designed as an opportunity for public health institutes to collaborate on potential new areas of work. During the conference, fourteen different collaborative practice design labs were held and led by select representatives from member public health institutes. Discussion during the sessions has been captured by NNPHI staff in short summary one pagers. *These one-pagers can be accessed by clicking on the session titles in the table below.*

The sessions have been categorized, by NNPHI staff, based on discussed action steps.

- **Reconvening Groups:** Collaborative practice design labs in this category have committed to specific action steps or have committed to reconvene within the next 6 months. Limited NNPHI staff support will be provided to support the groups to complete the action steps or reconvene the groups.
- **Resources Sharing Groups:** Collaborative practice design labs in this category had very few action steps, but participants committed to sharing resources around the topic. Limited NNPHI staff support will be provided to the groups to explore mechanisms to share resources.
- **Open to Continued Exploration Groups:** Collaborative practice design labs in this category did not have any clear action steps for collaboration. Based on interest of the members, NNPHI staff and topic champions may explore the possibility for continued discussion.

Our hope is that these groups continue to be led by the public health institutes and to continue the momentum of collaboration sparked by these sessions.
