

Request for Proposals: Development of a Protocol for a Demonstration Project to Increase Cervical Cancer Screening Coverage in the US Affiliated Pacific Islands

Deadline for Submission: 3:00 PM ET September 28, 2015

Overview

Through a cooperative agreement with the National Center for Chronic Disease Prevention and Health Promotion at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the National Network of Public Health Institutes (NNPHI) has been funded to identify and support subject matter experts (SMEs) with the development of a research protocol to assess the feasibility of implementing resource-appropriate cervical cancer screening and follow-up methodologies in the US Affiliated Pacific Islands (USAPI) to increase cervical cancer screening, follow-up and treatment of abnormal results.

The USAPI currently have low cervical cancer screening coverage (primarily Pap-smear screening) and follow-up rates; the demonstration project will examine the feasibility of implementing alternative resource-appropriate screening methods such as self-collection for primary human papillomavirus (HPV) testing or visual inspection with acetic acid (VIA) as well as immediate treatment, if needed, with cryotherapy in the USAPI.

NNPHI is seeking a team of researchers/SMEs in cervical cancer and cost-effectiveness analysis that can lead development of the research protocol for the demonstration project. The SMEs can be from the same organization or different organization, but one organization should be listed as the lead applicant.

Eligibility

This RFP is open to all U.S. based organizations/U.S. citizens who have experience with the following:

- Cervical cancer screening and treatment studies
- Unique health seeking behaviors of residents of the USAPI
- Engaging and collaborating with stakeholders in the USAPI
- Design of demonstration projects
- Cost-effectiveness analysis
- Team members may be from different organizations, but one organization should be listed as the lead applicant

Preference may be given to applicants who can leverage funds from other projects to travel to the USAPI and/or Hawaii. NNPHI encourages applicants to utilize a competitive indirect rate, comparable to standard off-campus project rates below 33%.

Funding Available

A total of \$80,000 is available for a team of researchers. Project related travel is not included in the total award amount and will be reimbursed separately. This contract is part of a larger cooperative agreement award between NNPHI and CDC. It is estimated that the primary expenses will be staff time. Subcontractors for components are permissible. NNPHI and the selected contractor will negotiate the budget and workplan once the contractor is selected.

Timeline

The project period will begin on October 15, 2015. All activities must be implemented by June 30, 2016. The selected contractor should anticipate an in-person meeting in Atlanta or Washington, DC during the first quarter of the project and attendance at either the Cancer Council of the Pacific Islands (CCPI) Semi-Annual Meeting (to be held December 5 – 10, 2015 in Hawaii) or site visit(s) to selected USAPI jurisdictions.

Scope of Work

The selected contractor will collaborate with NNPHI staff and CDC to develop and implement a workplan that includes the following objectives and activities:

- Identify two/three USAPI jurisdictions willing and able to implement a demonstration project to test the feasibility of using alternative resource-appropriate cervical cancer screening methods for diagnosis and treatment
- Plan and conduct site visits to the selected USAPI jurisdictions
- Develop a comprehensive written protocol for the demonstration project that includes:
 - Identification and engagement of key stakeholders in the development of the demonstration project protocol and identification of their roles in conducting the demonstration project
 - A plan for how to collaborate with USAPI partners to track data for the demonstration project and also strengthen current data systems for cervical cancer screening and treatment
 - Surveys developed to collect a wide range of data (including sociodemographic, screening, treatment, acceptability and cost data) on participants and the USAPI jurisdiction health infrastructure/systems

- A plan for participant recruitment and follow-up through care, if needed
- An enumeration of resources needed for future implementation of the developed protocol
- A cost-effectiveness assessment plan and relevant surveys for data that needs to be collected to conduct cost-effectiveness analyses of the demonstration project when implemented in the future
- Plan for engaging consultants from the University of Hawaii to ensure project activities adhere to culturally sensitive standards
- Prepare packages to obtain CDC clearance (IRB and OMB) and the relevant USAPI ethics committee clearances for the entire protocol and all surveys developed
- Examine current information about data systems for cervical cancer screening in the identified USAPI jurisdictions and engage stakeholders in developing action items that can be taken to improve data systems to track cervical cancer screening and treatment during the demonstration project

Deliverables

- A comprehensive protocol for the demonstration project to examine feasibility and costeffectiveness of alternative cervical cancer screening methods in two/three USAPI jurisdictions (including all relevant surveys)
- Completed packages to obtain for CDC and the relevant USAPI ethics committee clearances
- An action plan for the improvement of cervical cancer program data systems, developed collaboratively with stakeholders in the USAPI and various governmental agencies in preparation for the demonstration project

Selection Criteria

Applications will be reviewed by a panel including NNPHI and CDC staff.

Selection will be based on the following criteria. Please note the point value for each of the criteria listed:

- 1. Team's demonstrated knowledge and experience with (25 points):
 - a. Cervical cancer screening and treatment
 - b. Unique health seeking behaviors of residents of the USAPI
 - c. Engaging and collaborating with stakeholders in the USAPI
 - d. Appropriate quantitative and qualitative research methodologies, including experience with survey methodology and cost-effectiveness analysis
- 2. Plan for completing each activity from the scope of work (50 points):
 - Identify two/three USAPI Jurisdictions willing and able to implement a demonstration project and conduct site visits to the selected USAPI jurisdictions or schedule meetings with stakeholders at the CCPI Semi-Annual Meeting in Hawaii
 - b. Develop a comprehensive written protocol for the demonstration project
 - c. Develop a cost-effectiveness assessment plan and relevant surveys to conduct cost-effectiveness analyses of the demonstration project when implemented in the future
 - d. Prepare packages for submission for CDC clearance (IRB and OMB) and the relevant USAPI ethics committee clearances for the entire protocol and all surveys developed
 - e. Examine current information about data systems for cervical cancer screening in the identified USAPI jurisdictions
 - f. Engage stakeholders in developing action items that can be taken to improve data systems to track cervical cancer screening and treatment during the demonstration project
- 3. Demonstrated capacity of the team to implement project and meet all project requirements within budget including expertise of the proposed staff within budget (15 points)
- 4. Completeness and quality of the proposal, including inclusion of clear budget and budget justification (10 points)

 - Identify and engage key stakeholders in development of demonstration project protocol and identification of their roles in conducting the demonstration project
 - Collaborate with USAPI partners to track data for the demonstration project and also strengthen current data systems for cervical cancer screening and treatment
 - Develop survey to collect a wide range of data (including socio-demographic, screening, treatment, acceptability and cost data) on participants and the USAPI jurisdiction health infrastructure/systems
 - Recruit participants and follow-up through care, if needed
 - d. Enumerate resources needed for future implementation of the developed protocol
 - e. Develop a cost-effectiveness assessment plan and relevant surveys for data that needs to be collected to conduct cost-effectiveness analyses of the demonstration project when implemented in the future.

- f. Prepare packages to obtain CDC clearance (IRB and OMB) and the relevant USAPI ethics committee clearances for the entire protocol and all surveys.
- g. Examine current information about data systems for cervical cancer screening in the identified USAPI jurisdictions and engage stakeholders in developing action items that can be taken to improve data systems to track cervical cancer screening and treatment during the demonstration project.

 - a. Qualifications for this work, including experience developing and implementing demonstration projects.
 - b. Confirmation that contractor has the capacity to meet all project requirements before June 30, 2016.
