

RESOURCE AND PRESENTATION GUIDE:

Conducting Successful CHA/CHIPs Virtually During COVID-19 Fall 2020







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▶ PURPOSE

As COVID-19 upended performance improvement work at public health departments across the country, many assessment and planning activities transitioned to a virtual environment for the health and safety of the workforce and their communities. Through a six-session ECHO Public Health series supported by the Public Health Performance Improvement Network (phPIN), performance improvement practitioners were introduced to tools, strategies, and other resources to aid in this transition, specifically for activities related to community health assessments (CHAs) and community health improvement plans (CHIPs). This guide includes presentation recordings, resources, and tools that were featured in the training series.

► TOOLS FOR VIRTUAL COLLABORATION AND ORGANIZATION

All tools listed below have a free version available, with reasonably priced versions available that allow for some additional functionality.

Concept Board: Virtual whiteboard that provides space for collaboration, design thinking, and planning with templates and sticky notes (similar to Mural)

Mentimeter: Interactive presentation tool (could be used instead of PowerPoint) that integrates polling and other interactive features

Miro: Virtual whiteboard space for collaboration and brainstorming that allows three free boards and unlimited team members

Mural: Workspace for virtual collaboration that includes templates, frameworks, sticky notes, and other customizable features

<u>Padlet:</u> Virtual board that allows you to post and share notes, files, and collaborate with others (here's a <u>great list</u> of uses for Padlet)

Refining Your Ideas Worksheet: This tool will help you transition from a basic idea on a post-it note to a fully articulated idea with clarified details



<u>Trello:</u> Virtual project management and collaboration tool that tracks tasks and progress, allows users to assign tasks, and follow a workflow

Wheel of Involvement: This wheel will help engage attendees at a workshop or consultation to provide you with input regarding their own desired level of involvement

▶ RESOURCES FOR DATA VISUALIZATION AND SHARING

Hosting a Data Walk, Tamarack Institute

A data walk is a powerful process for engaging diverse stakeholders in a shared sense-making process around data. This data walk guide builds knowledge and data capacity, engages residents, and encourages dialogue and mutual understanding with diverse perspectives.

Rose, Bud, Thorn, Tamarack Institute

This framework is a great way to gather input from a large group. It creates space for different types of thinkers and contributors to share their feedback and provides structure to keep feedback conversations on topic.

► TOOLS FOR VIRTUAL DATA VISUALIZATION

mySidewalk: This tool helps communities use visualized data to track, analyze, and communicate progress on their goals and performance measures. This tool is focused primarily on geospatial data, so it creates interactive maps and other data visualizations to communicate data.

Piktochart: This tool will help you create data visualizations including reports, presentations, infographics, social media graphics, or printable visuals. Your first five visuals are free.

<u>Plus/Delta (+/ Δ):</u> This quality tool provides a simple method for individuals or teams to engage in reflection as an approach to continuous improvement. The +/ Δ evaluation can help inform the changes needed to achieve higher levels of performance.
